## Choraegus ShareMusic Rehearsal Notes

### **General**

Cultivate a light, clear, fairly bright timbre - calypso music is happy and cheery, so let it shine!

### **Choir**

Work the syncopation on the chorus carefully because the accompaniment rhythm is significantly different. I recommend you take it as slowly as necessary to get it right, and then increase speed to tempo with successive repetitions.

The same rhythmic considerations apply to the verses.

### **Accompanist**

Enjoy your chorus countermelody!
